Report from Church Center Global Office - Peter Ng:

Regarding Asian Ministry, Peter does international work, whereas Fred takes care of Domestic ministry. In 2010, they work closely but lots of 'grey area'. Different offices share resources. In 2011 they are working closely on several projects. There are 16 young adults serving: 2 in Japan, 1 in India. It is a life changing experience for young adults.

Work closely with Anglican Provinces in Asia

- Chinese Christian Council along with the general secretary of Hong Kong will be visiting the national office
- Korean convocation gathering will be held in Seoul, encourage bishops to participate

- The need to be on site to experience the cultural differences of different countries
- Communications must be kept open between provinces in Asia so we can deepen our relationship and partnership
- Sharing of resources is important, e.g. bilingual prayer books. UTO is a good resource.
- Jubilee ministry continues to provide grant, this is a social outreach arm.

Discussions:

- (A) Moved to change name of Internship Fund to Education Fund by The Rev. Dr. Fran Toy, thus less restrictive, seconded by The Rev. David Lui MOTION: Trust office to make decision at officers' discretion. Motion carried.
- (B) Prayer Book fund to be moved to General Fund by The Rev. Judy Lin, seconded by The Rev. Dr. Fran Toy. Money continues to be held by EAM council.

Motion carried.

(C) General Fund – Convener states that the use of the fund was not clear. Peter Ng explained that it was originally set up as trust fund for Chinese Convocation Endowment fund. The fundraising stopped and the money was transferred to the Episcopal Church Center account and it was only last year to have it taken out and deposited into EAM Council Account.

MOTION: Karina moved to have the fund as General Fund for general use, seconded by The Rev. Dr. Fran Toy.

Motion carried.

The fund is to be allocated at the discretion of EAM Chinese Convocation officers.

MOTION: 10% of the Fund money can be designated for congregational development. Moved by The Rev. Dr. Gordon Lau, seconded by The Rev. Dr. Fran Toy.

Motion carried.

The Rev. Ada Wong Nagata pledged to donate over \$600 to the General Fund so to make it \$10,000, thus this year \$1,000 can be granted for congregational

development. She encouraged members to give if they can to share abundance with others in need.
